

Voter Registration Closes Soon

In all but a few states, residents must register prior to Election Day in order to vote.

In 15 key states, the registration deadline is 30 days before Election Day.

This year, Election Day is November 5.

You must be registered by **October 7** if you live in Alaska, Arkansas, Hawaii, Louisiana, Michigan, Mississippi, Montana, Ohio, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island, South Carolina, Tennessee, Texas or Washington State or the District of Columbia.

Many states end voter registration 29 or 28 days before the election, including: Arizona; Colorado; Florida; Illinois; Indiana; Kentucky; Missouri; New Jersey; New Mexico and Virginia.

New York State allows voter registration to continue until 25 days before the election.

In California, voter registration is permitted up to 15 days before the election.

This year, voters nationwide will elect 33 Senators, 435 Representatives and 36 Governors. The leadership of the House and Senate will be determined, setting in motion the legislative agenda of the party in control.

The direction of the economy, foreign policy and national security will be decided by the men and women looking for your votes today. Your ability to influence their decisions begins with your decision to vote.

You can't vote if you're not registered.
